

# FACILITATING SAFE AND REGULAR MIGRATION PATHWAYS IN A CHANGING CLIMATE: LESSONS FROM GCM IMPLEMENTATION

In a changing climate where the intensity and frequency of disasters is increasing, many more people are compelled to leave their homes each year while others remain trapped in areas at risk. The availability and use of regular pathways in these contexts are not meeting current needs and are likely insufficient to meet future demands. There are, however, existing tools and policy instruments that can be scaled up and replicated. At this **official International Migration Review Forum (IMRF) side event**, a diverse range of high-level speakers will present and discuss national, regional and local migration policy perspectives, instruments and practices to address human mobility challenges in the context of disasters, climate change and environmental degradation. Based on the latest evidence and analysis of the Global Compact for Migration (GCM) implementation, the side event will identify policy gaps and opportunities for the future.
